

The Wild and Free Roaming Horse & Burro Act of 1971 states: "...That Congress finds and declares that wild free-roaming horses and burros are living symbols of the historic and pioneer spirit of the West; that they contribute to the diversity of life forms within the Nation and enrich the lives of the American people;

*and that these horses and burros are fast disappearing from the American scene."*

Yet the Bureau of Land Management (BLM) wants to continue eliminating our wild herds and reducing the remaining herds to levels *well below* the population in 1971. Below is a list showing the number of wild horses or burros the BLM deems appropriate for each herd. At minimum, 150 breeding adults are needed in a herd for genetic diversity.

**In nearly all the herds, BLM does not allow for enough genetic diversity.**

**To allow a herd to have less than 10 or even 50 wild horses or burros is not managing our wild herds - it's eliminating them.**
